




























WRITING ACTIVITY

Write Your OWN Animal Adventure!

Directions: Jack and Annie have had so many fun adventures with animal friends. Imagine the magic tree house has whisked you away on a brand-new adventure. Which animal sidekick would you bring along? Where in the world would you explore with Jack and Annie? What period of history would you find yourself in? What happens next? Finish the story below or on your own paper, and go on a Magic Tree House adventure of your very own!



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CRAFT ACTIVITY

The More You Read, the **Bigger Your Tree Will Grow**

Track your reading progress as you go on adventures with Jack and Annie.

Read any the animal books below and build your tree!

Ask your parent's permission before using scissors!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Green construction paper (or plain white paper)
- Brown construction paper (or plain white paper)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Colored Pens, Markers. or Crayons

STEP 1:

With your brown construction paper and drawing utensils, draw a tree trunk and tree branches for your leaves to sprout from. If you don't have construction paper, just use plain white paper that you can color in. With your parent's help, cut out these items and tape them to a window, wall, or other hard surface, like your bedroom door.

STEP 2:

Decide what your reading goal will be this week, and write that on one of your tree branches. Most important, start reading!

STEP 3:

Once you've completed your first reading goal, make a leaf out of green paper (or white paper colored green). Write the name of the book that you're reading and the chapter(s) that

you've just completed on your newly created leaf. Tape the leaf to your tree trunk—your tree is now taking shape!

Add a new leaf every time you complete a reading goal. The more books you read, the more your tree will grow! Before you know it, you will have a fully formed tree that Jack and Annie would be proud to have their tree house in!

CRAFT ACTIVITY

Popsicle Stick Dinosaur

Create your own "pet" dinosaur with this craft idea!

Ask your parent's permission before using scissors!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Popsicle sticks
- Green paint
- Glue
- Card stock or heavy paper
- Scissors
- Colored pens, pencils, markers or crayons



Join Jack & Annie's on their very first adventure to learn more about dinosaurs!





STEP 1:

Paint three popsicle sticks green and let them dry. Once they are dry, glue them into a triangle.

STEP 2:

Create a body for your dinosaur. With your paper, have your parents help you cut these shapes:

- A large triangle for the body
- A long oval for the tail
- A few small, triangular spikes for the back
- Rectangles for the legs
- An L-shape for the head

STEP 3:

Glue the large triangle representing the body onto the back of the popsicle sticks. Then glue the head, tail, legs, and spikes onto the dinosaur and let the glue dry.

STEP 3:

Once dry, use drawing utensils of your choosing to draw a face and a design on your dinosaur. Now you've made a dinosaur that is one for the (prehistoric) ages!



CRAFT ACTIVITY

Make Your Own Cotton Ball Polar Bear!

A polar bear has translucent, fluffy fur that helps keep it warm in the icy Arctic. With this craft activity, you can create your own furry polar bear!



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Cotton balls
- Glue
- Drawing utensils Paper

STEP 1:

On a piece of paper, draw an outline of a polar bear the way you imagined it in Jack and Annie's adventure in *Polar Bears Past Bedtime*, or you can use the one on this activity sheet for reference!

STEP 2:

Bring your drawing to life, using cotton balls to create fluffy fur! With glue, affix the cotton balls inside the outline of the polar. Keep gluing the cotton balls until the polar bear is completely filled in.

Shark Jaws

Make your own shark jaws using the instructions below.

Ask your parent's permission before using scissors!

STEP 1:

Flip the paper plate over so the bottom side is facing up. Then fold it in half and position the plate so that the fold is closest to you. With a pencil, starting from the fold, draw a large semicircle.

STEP 2:

Keeping the plate folded and with your parent's help, use scissors to cut out the semicircle.

STEP 3:

Draw triangles around the edge of the semicircle you just cut out. It should look like a zigzag when you're done. With your parent's help, use scissors to cut out the triangles. Unfold the plate and behold your shark jaw full of scary, pointy teeth! For extra fun, color in the teeth!

COOKING ACTIVITY

Banana Sushi Recipe

From Jack and Annie's magic tree house to your house!



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

1 Banana 1 Tortilla Peanut Butter

STEP 1:

Placing the tortilla on a flat surface, coat it with a thin layer of peanut butter.

STEP 2:

Peel a banana and place it on the tortilla. Wrap the tortilla tightly around it.

When working in the kitchen with sharp objects and hot appliances, make sure you have adult supervision and help!

STEP 3:

Spread a small amount of peanut butter along the inside edge of the tortilla to keep it closed.

STEP 4:

Slice the tortilla into one inch sections, and enjoy!





COOKING ACTIVITY

Pigs in a Blanket Recipe

From Jack and Annie's magic tree house to your house!



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

1 Tube of Crescent Rolls 8 Hot Dogs Salt and Pepper

STEP 1:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

STEP 2:

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Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

STEP 3:

Roll out the crescent rolls into a sheet and tear where perforated. Cut each triangle into three smaller triangles.

STEP 4:

Separately, cut your hot dogs into threes.

When working in the kitchen with sharp objects and hot appliances, make sure you have adult supervision and help!

STEP 5:

Wrap a strip of the dough around each hot dog piece, leaving a little space at the edges. Place on cooking sheet.

STEP 6:

Spinkle the tops with salt and pepper.

STEP 7:

Place into oven and bake for 10–12 minutes or until golden brown.

STEP 8:

Enjoy!

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




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DINOSAUR MAZE





Jack and Annie are searching for a few things before they head out on their next adventure. Can you help them by finding these items in your house and in your backyard?



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
